Products Stewardship

We utilize management procedures and systems specifically designed to minimize the use of hazardous chemicals, employee training to safely handle those chemicals which have no substitute, reduce consumption of natural resources, reuse and recycle materials, and to minimize the generation of waste. Allstate Can collects and recycles scrap metal from every production run.

Hazardous Communication (HAZCOM) Training – all employees annually

Steel – Recycle with Cinelli Iron & Metal

Copper – Recycle with Freeport McMoran (formerly Phelps Dodge)

Oil, oil absorbents, and used solvents – removed and recycled by GTI Environmental Services

Corrugated paper, office paper, and plastic strapping and wrapping – recycled with King Disposal Inc.

Continuous Improvement

We continually review our environmental practices to improve our performance and efficiencies with regard to the environment.

1996 – Removal of all VAT tiles in our facility

1997 – Replaced all propane forklifts with electric forklifts

1999 – Removal of boiler and asbestos in boiler room

1999 – Installation of efficient Gordon Ray BH Infrared Heaters in manufacturing area

1999 – Installation of 2/5 day programmable thermostats throughout plant and office

2002 – Installation of hand dryers in restrooms (no paper towels)

2006 – Installation of high efficiency lights on infrared motion detectors in manufacturing and warehouse

Current – Researching solar panel installation for roof of our building (135,000 sq. ft.)

We promote participation and communicate our commitment to efficient environmental management by promoting environmental responsibilities among our employees via an ongoing training process. We have always run an open manufacturing environment and encourage visits from customers and suppliers.
